A bit more on the gear and packing:

Gear

Given my warm climate blood, I get cold quite easily. Ideally I prefer temps in the high 70s mid 80s. Late last year I discovered heated gear and once you try it, you will never go back. I have Gerbing heated socks, pant & jacket liners and gloves, with a bluetooth heat controller. I did a Colorado cold ride test last month and I was warm and toasty down to the mid 30's at 60-70% heat. No bulky layers, just the long sleeve T shirt, long johns, the heated gear covered by my Aerostich one piece R3 suit.

I have been reading the various ride reports, Rain and Alaska go together. The R3 is fully waterproof and covers you neck to ankles. Together with my Sidi Canyon Gore-Tex Boots and Schuberth E1 lid, I am waterproof head to toes. I am also bringing a 2 piece Jacket & Pants, and couple pairs of gloves for the nicer days.

My off the bike clothing is minimal, long/short convertible pants, a few long/short T shirts, a pullover jacket and hiking boots, undies and wool socks.

I learned from my friend DH to pack a tool kit. It has everything to do minor adjustments and repairs: wrenches, torx, allen, compressor, wire, tape, pliers, ferry straps, disc lock, spark plugs, etc. The piece of wood is to keep the front wheel elevated in case you have to take it off. Note to self - buy some JB Weld. Just in case, I make sure my BMW MOA roadside assistance is always paid up.



The entire set is the size of the pannier's footprint and fits nicely in a tray and its only 3" high leaving plenty of room for the other stuff.



Packing

Top Case - I wired it with twin USB ports and 12V outlet, and its mostly empty aside from small electronics, camera battery charger, snacks bars, etc. I usually it holds my helmet.

Right Pannier - my spare riding gear, hiking boots and spare gloves Left Pannier - Tools and my off the bike clothing in a waterproof compression bag. They say Beemer panniers are waterproof, somehow water always finds its way there.

Under the seat - I always carry a 2nd compressor, tire plug kit, and the OEM tools

Wow, what a day!




Another high mileage day, but it just flowed smoothly except for the 20 minute shower that dirtied my bike and self. Mud was everywhere.

Skip this post if you are not a feeling kind of person.

I would definitely recommend doing this road with another rider, let me explain and share some of my thoughts. I filled my tank full in Watson Lake and felt well prepared. As I embarked on the journey, the road was ok maintained, but wet and slippery. As I piled on the miles and looked at my gas range for the point of no return, it became intimidating. 212 KM forward to Faro or 212 KM back to Watson Lake.

But as the weather turned from overcast to heavy rain and then to sleet and more rain, my

mind wondered. The road got slippery, and more slippery. It reminded me of Oklahoma clay, and then suddenly a glimmer of clear skies emerged and all was well.

So, the question is how do you deal with this kind of emotions on a solo ride? For sure, if there are 2 of you, you can watch out for each other. Solo, bring a satellite InReach (no I'm not getting paid to promote) to make you feel better and carry it on your person. Not one of the coveted handle bar mounts because if you come off the bike you may not be able to get to it.

So as I pressed on I looked at my gas range and I'm my mind calculated the point of no return, 1/2 way to Faro, I decided to press on. As the weather deteriorated, I thought about what if there is a deep water crossing up ahead and now I don't have the return range? Mind you, I had been riding for 250 KM and not seen a car or met a soul near me, just my beemer, heated gear and me. Can't forget my security blanked: InReach Explorer.

This really cemented in my mind what I had always read and thought about the Yukon, a vast, rugged, lonely and out of the way place. On the lonely part, out of my 7 days on the road, this is the first time I never met anyone. 13 hours without human interaction. I saw 2 cars between WL and Faro. After Faro, the gas stations were 24x7 credit card only service with no one around.

Well I made it to Dawson City and it all changed, a great, very welcoming little place with lots of stuff around. I met several folks and got my fill of human interaction.

When I arrived at Coldfoot, it was a bit before noon and thought about how I would spend the


rest on the day and the rest of the following day there. That's when I decided to push to get to Deadhorse. It works out quite well, the following day, I can do the AM Artic tour and head to Coldfoot for an overnight, the Fairbanks by noon/early afternoon the next day. Make sure to sign up for the Artic tour 24Hrs in advance. I topped on my tank @4.59 per gallon, next service was 240 miles away. With a 1200GSA, range has never been an issue, traveling around 50MPH, I can get 350+ miles.

The ride on the haul road is an experience, I learned to relish the reprieve of a few paved miles every now and then. There are 2 long stretches of decent pavement before and after Coldfoot. Contrary to what I had read, I found truckers very courteous and generally any vehicle traffic. I saw about 6 motorcyclist on their return back and 3 groups of cyclist. As a cyclist myself, this is tough topography for cycling, steep, long hills, rough road and quite windy and cold.

On the InReach, if you travel solo to these remote places, my opinion is you must have it, on you, not on your bike on some RAM mount. I can tell for me it gives me almost the same comfort as having a companion ride along. If you have a bad day, they can find you if the dot is not moving, and you are laying there in the wilderness. If you are conscious, you can call for help. Turn the Bluetooth off and you are good to go for 4 days on battery power.



To navigate the pot holes between miles 50 and 80, use the full road, there is very little traffic. From 80 to the end it was pretty good. Out of ten, 8.5 because of the potholes. Day 11 - Tuesday, June 6th, 2017

Another beautiful day, sunny and 65F at 8:30AM. I pretty much just headed south to Fairbanks enjoying the landscape and laughing about the night before.

It finally dawned on me why I liked Atigun Pass so much. It is the fact that it is isolated, a gravel road and primitive when compared to the paved passes that are more typical in the lower 48. The pipeline looks odd and out of place within such a pristine beautiful terrain, on the other hand, if it wasn't for it, there would be no road.



My assessment of the Dalton: it's a tough road, not just because of its technical riding challenges, but because of the combination of both, it's difficulty and it's length. The difficult sections are not long, but require concentration, and as the miles wear on you, be careful and slow down. I did the ride up in one long day! The ride back in 2 days was far easier. The section between Atigun and Deadhorse is long and will definitely test your endurance. Be ready for big pot holes, dips, bumps, slippery smooth surfaces and miles of unpaved riding. I actually slowed down on the paved surfaces to enjoy the reprieve from the dirt a bit longer. Regardless, I would never pass upon the chance of riding to Deadhorse.



As you approach Fairbanks the landscape becomes greener and turns to rolling hills. I am amazed how much I enjoyed the same road twice within 2 days. One sees different things, angles and views.





Finding myself in Fairbanks far quicker than I thought, this give me a chance to plan the next few days. After buying some essential, I prepared for tomorrow's oil change, I removed the long Touratech bash plate and another rinse at the car wash. I am very glad to remove the bash plate, Dalton Calcium Chloride was caked on. Now time to catch up with my Family.

day from Dalas to Prudhoe is pretty fast. I enjoyed it soooo very much.






